THE CHURCH IS NOT A BUILDING

Day after day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Christ. Acts 5:42

The place in which a church meets varies. The use of big buildings, complex organizations, involved programs, huge budgets that provide for schools, hospitals, orphanages and other social activities are only possible in financially strong unrestricted societies.

Although the Lord has blessed these activities in many places in the world, we must recognize that they are not essential to the existence of the church. In some countries these activities are forbidden by the government, while in others, the local economic situation makes them impossible. Still the church can thrive, because it is not dependent on these things. Serious problems have arisen when Christians have become confused on this point.

A number of years ago, some Vietnamese church leaders thought that their lack of funds was the cause of the slow growth of Christianity there. On one occasion, the following conversation was overheard:

"Do you have communists in your part of the country?" the observer asked. "Most assuredly. They are there," the leader replied. "Are they growing in numbers and influence?" he then asked. The leader hesitated momentarily, then admitted sadly, "Yes, they are growing very fast." "Can you show me their meeting places and schools or introduce me to their leaders?" the observer continued. "Certainly not," the leader said in disgust. "If they are known, they will be arrested." "You mean they are secret, without buildings or property and still they grow in number?" the observer asked in amazement. "Yes, you could say that," the leader responded. "Then it must be that their growing influence does not depend on such things. If they can be wrong in their beliefs and still grow without money and buildings, why do you think the church of Jesus Christ needs these things?" the man concluded.

If God provides these things, then use them for His glory. If He does not, remember that the New Testament church had none of these things, but they turned their world upside down (Acts 17:6). The early Christians did not confuse the church's functions with methods. If they had done so, the church would have died in the bondage of Jewish legalism. The early churches were not encumbered by the presence of buildings, nor hindered by the lack of them. They met in public places, when they were permitted to do so, but when they were not, they went from house to house.

Let us pray for a better understanding of the biblical functions of the church and not confuse them with bricks and mortar. Thank the Lord for the boldness and willingness of our persecuted brothers and sisters, who use their homes as centers for worship and declaration of the good news of the love of God.

Cherryvale News

Since the shut down in March, much of the day to day functions of Cherryvale have remained the same. Even though our doors were temporarily closed, our mission did not change: To love God, Grow together and serve our community. And as we navigate through the re-opening process and the upcoming holiday months, we look to continue in our efforts to love God, Grow together and serve you, our church family.

If and when you feel comfortable returning to Cherryvale, you may notice a few changes around the place.

In the sanctuary the big change you will see is a newly constructed 'sound booth' which houses the equipment we use to 'live stream' the service on Sunday morning. Broadcasting our worship service has become an integral part of Sunday morning, and we have been contacted by folks as far away as South America and California, that have watched and are following our worship. When Jesus said to 'go and make disciples' He probably wasn't thinking about YouTube, the internet and social media; but those are the tools available today, so we are taking advantage of them to reach those who may need to hear the gospel. This technology also enables us to offer online bible study and to live steam other events, to those who may not be able to be physically present in the building. It was hard to miss the news in August of the flooding in and around Staunton. 2 Saturdays, 2 weeks apart, both storms unexpected and both storms bringing close to 5" of rain in a couple of hours. Many businesses and homes were damaged beyond repair. Some businesses had just completed repairs from the first flood only to have them all undone by the second.

Bears and Blankets is a child daycare, family owned business that suffered such a loss. They provide day care for working parents, many of whom are essential workers. Months of drying out and repairs while still providing a safe and loving place for child care, was not an option for them. They needed a solution and fast. The owners met with Pastor Viv and worked out a plan to utilize the empty basement space at Cherryvale. One week later, the basement was transformed and 20 or so happy, laughing and joyful children had a safe place to be cared for; and as an added bonus, they now have a playground and space to play outside.

Bears and Blankets will be with us for the next 6 months or so, while they fix the flood damage and make plans for the future of their business.

Pastor Viv says, "if you ever feel like you need a pick-me-up, come and sit in the sanctuary, and listen to the shouts of delight and laughter from the children downstairs - it truly does your heart good to hear them.

Many of the trees on the church property have been there since long before the church was built. 5 or 6 of them are really causing a problem to the church and our neighbors. Over the next few weeks we plan to remove a tree that causes water to come into the building. The others will be trimmed back, away from our neighbors property line.

After 30 plus years of service, the old air conditioning units that service the education and children's wing, were replaced. For several years now, we have been recharging them and paying for service calls, in an attempt to extend their life. The leadership team finally decided it was time to put them out 'to pasture' and go with new and up to date units.

Flood Buckets / Cleaning Kits

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is currently focusing efforts on Cleaning Kits (aka Flood Buckets) Hygiene Kits, and School Kits.

Cleaning Kits provide supplies to help individuals and families clean up after flooding, hurricanes, tornadoes, and other natural disasters. Hygiene kits replace basic necessity items lost in a disaster such as toothbrushes, hand towels and soap to help people stay clean and healthy. School kits include school supplies for children as they return to the classroom. Full details of each kit and instructions are on our website www.cherryvaleumc.com.

If you prefer to make a financial contribution to enable UMCOR to purchase relief kits, you can contribute \$75 for each cleaning kit; \$12 for each health kit; and \$11 for each school kit. Additionally, UMCOR asks for \$1 per kit (\$3 for cleaning buckets) to cover processing and shipping, and \$1 for toothpaste for each health kit. All checks (for processing and shipping, for toothpaste, and in lieu of providing kits) should be made payable to "Virginia Conference UMC", earmarked for "kits" and mailed to Treasurer, Virginia Conference of The United Methodist Church, P O Box 5606, Glen Allen, VA 23058 any time prior to Annual Conference. The information is also posted and will be updated on the conference website at www.vaumc.org/ac2020.

Saint Paul's UMC in Staunton has volunteered to be our collection sight for the District kits. If you have kits please bring them to St. Paul's UMC, 2000 Shutterlee Mill Road, Staunton, VA 24401 beginning Monday, September 21st. They will be collected until Friday, October 9th.
